Jante Law

There is a prevailing mental attitude and social theme buried in the soil of Scandinavian life and culture that immensely affects the general psychological cultivation of the region as a whole. It is called Jante Law. It's ten basic rules are summarized below:

- 1. You're not to think you are anything special.
- 2. You're not to think you are as good as we are.
- 3. You're not to think you are smarter than we are.
- 4. You're not to convince yourself that you are better than we are.
- 5. You're not to think you know more than we do.
- 6. You're not to think you are more important than we are.
- 7. You're not to think you are good at anything.
- 8. You're not to laugh at us.
- 9. You're not to think anyone cares about you.
- 10. You're not to think you can teach us anything.

Though introduced many years ago, these unofficial, humanistic principles are still clearly evidenced today. One Danish column expressed the seriousness of Jante Law in Denmark by stating, "In Denmark we do not raise the inventive, the hardworking, the ones with initiative, the successful or the outstanding, we create hopelessness, helplessness and the sacred, ordinary mediocrity" (Jyllands-Posten, a Danish newspaper).

One can only imagine the spiritual side effects and deprivation that arises under this degree of humanism, but through it we can see and understand their spiritual need for the Savior, Jesus Christ, who graciously offers joy, help, hope, and eternal life. What's more, God also gives us purpose and pursuit, passion, self-abandonment, selfless ambition, and a Great Commission to work towards in a joint enterprise with His Son and Holy Spirit!
